What is it?

Police Officer - Police officers keep law and order, investigate crime, and support crime prevention. To be a successful and competent Police Officer, you will need: legal knowledge, negotiating skills, patience, and the ability to remain calm in stressful situations. Excellent verbal communication skills, leadership skills and be able to use a computer and the main software packages competently.

Day to day tasks

- respond to calls for help from the public.
- investigate crimes and offences.
- interview suspects and make arrests.
- give evidence in court.
- control traffic and crowds at large public events and gatherings
- advise the public on personal safety and crime prevention.
- promote respect for people in relation to their race, diversity, and human rights.

Qualifications

2 or more GCSEs at 9 to 3 grades Public Service Level 3 Qualification or Apprenticeship.

A Levels or equivalent are required for senior roles
