What is it?

A career in the Army offers opportunities to serve your country in various roles, both at home and abroad. Soldiers in the Army fulfil a wide range of responsibilities, including combat roles, support roles, technical roles, and leadership positions.

Qualifications/Experience Required:

The qualifications and experience required to join the Army depend on the specific role you're interested in. Generally, you'll need to meet certain basic criteria, meeting certain fitness and health standards, and passing aptitude tests. Some roles may require specific educational qualifications or experience, while others may offer training on the job.

What the Work Involves:

Serving your country in various capacities, including combat operations, peacekeeping missions, disaster relief efforts, and more. Undertaking rigorous training to develop skills in leadership, teamwork, communication, and problem-solving.

Additionally, the Army provides access to further education and training, which can enhance your skills and qualifications for civilian employment after leaving the service.
