Generic responsibilities:

- Carrying out the professional duties of a tutor as circumstances may require and in accordance with Trust policies, under the direction of the Head of School.
- Promoting the achievement of high standards through effecting mentoring, teaching and learning within subject area, preparation and evaluation
- Being central in the delivery of the ECM agenda, paying regard to the provision of personalisation for students.
- Modelling the vision and values of the Trust.
- Being part of the team of North East Learning Trust.
- Receiving and acting on feedback to build on the strengths and improve personal performance within the Academy systems.
- Recognising, promoting and celebrating diversity.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Delivering intervention programmes to individuals preparing relevant and appropriate learning experiences in conjunction with the Department staff.
- Discussing reasons for under performance with students, through interview.
- Assisting in the development of suitable intervention material.
- Keeping a log on students who undertake intervention and assist on the recording and reporting procedures.
- Liaising regularly with the Head of Mathematics and teachers to inform them of progress and provide relevant feedback.
- Supporting exam revision sessions as required.
- Attending Maths departmental meetings as required.
- Working with other professionals such as the Pastoral Team, Directors of Learning and Assistant Learning Mentors to support students.
- Complying with the Trust's Child Safeguarding Procedures including regular liaison with the Academy's Designated Child Safeguarding Person over any safeguarding issues or concerns;



- Complying with the Trust policies and procedures at all times.
