

Year 10 Work Experience Placements – Parent/Carer Information

Your child will be taking part in work experience from the **week commencing Monday 10th July 2023** as part of their school curriculum.

Work Experience is the most important factor in shaping young people's perceptions of the world of work. It helps them learn about a particular occupation and gain valuable skills and independence, including:

- Introducing them to the knowledge, skills and attitudes that future employers will look for such as punctuality, reliability and attendance
- Practice in making job applications, writing letters of application or CVs, telephone, and interview techniques
- Developing personal skills including communication and teamwork.

Although we encourage independence, careers staff will be available to support students locating a suitable placement. Students will not always source placements related to their chosen future career industry; however, all placements provide an invaluable experience of the world of work and provide the opportunity to receive employer references that can be added to CVs.

Students will be attending an information assembly in the beginning of January. They will receive information packs including forms that will require completion by the company that they will be carrying out their placement. This information will also be emailed to all Year 10 parents/carers.





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Post 16 Advice

Year 11 students will continue with preparations for their forthcoming Mock Exams; Interventions will commence this term.

Mrs Carter and Mrs Collins will continue to provide careers advice and guidance. Students can also drop into SC7 to look at the many Post-16 information and course booklets.

Here is the Year 11 check list:

- Use the Careers OneNote link that has been emailed to all students. Links to all the local post-16 providers, advice and links about the new qualification T Levels and Apprenticeships.
- Check out the Open Day Notices outside SC7, links can also be found on the Careers OneNote.
- Attend Open Events some are virtual
- Submit your applications you can apply to multiple colleges/sixth forms/training providers and make your final choice later next year.
- Contact Universities if you have a particular career in mind which will require a degree or equivalent qualification - some universities ask for specific A Levels for some of their degree courses.
