Cardiologist – Cardiologists are Doctors who specialise in working with the heart. They work with patients to treat ongoing illnesses or respond to emergency, potentially life-threatening situations. Cardiologists work to prevent illnesses as well as treat current illnesses.

Day to day tasks

- identify and diagnose heart and cardiovascular diseases.

- develop treatment plans for patients based on their specific condition and medical history.

- provide consultations to other medical professionals.

- conduct research to improve the understanding of heart and cardiovascular diseases.

- educate patients on how to manage their condition.

- monitor patients over time to ensure that their condition is being properly managed.

- provide critical care to patients experiencing heart attacks.

Qualifications

5 GCSEs – grades 9 – 6 including English and Maths and Science A Levels – at least one must be Biology. Degree in Medicine plus on the job training to qualify as a Cardiologist.

The workforce is projected to grow by 5.3% over the period to 2027, creating 16,700 jobs. In the same period, 52.1% of the workforce is projected to retire, creating 162,500 job openings.

You'll first need to complete a degree in medicine This usually takes five or six years to complete.
