We have some sporting superstars here at Easington Academy - here's a summary of just some of the successes we've seen this term...

County cup final winners: Our Year 10 and 11 girls made history when they beat Parkside 6-1 in the county cup finals and were crowned Durham County Champions. The girls played brilliantly in the final and it was a testimony to the commitment they have shown over the past years.

East Durham schools district victories: Year 8 students Jack Whittle-Richens and Arron Bowman were county cup winners for East Durham district schools football team, beating Chester le Street, Washington and Derwentside in the final this term. Year 9/10 students Tyler Jones, Evan Buck, Finlay Foster, Ethan Thomson, Kal Coulthard, Jayden Pow, Harley Banks and Rylie Johnson also won the county cup for East Durham district schools football team beating Bishop Auckland in the final - fantastic achievements!

Year 7/8 athletics competition: A whopping 34 students from Years 7 and 8 travelled to Wellfield School to take part in the East Durham schools athletics competition. The Year 7 and 8 teams both won their competitions with some amazing individual performances. The Year 8 boys' team won 7 out of their 8 events which is a fantastic achievement.
