What is it?

Postal Worker

A Postal Worker collects, sorts and delivers letters and packages to homes and businesses. They are part of the logistics sector because they keep constant contact between business and people. These workers can also collect letters from places of work, post offices and post boxes within a district.

Day to day tasks

- sort the mail for your route, by hand or using machinery
- load and unload delivery vans
- walk for up to 6 hours a day to deliver mail
- use a hand-held computer device to get customer signatures
- pick up mail from post boxes, post offices and businesses
- deal with wrongly addressed or returned mail
- move mail to and from processing centres, delivery offices, railway stations and airports

Qualifications

3/4 GCSEs, usually including English and maths, or equivalent, for an intermediate apprenticeship.

Salary

Ranging from £16,000 for starters, rising to £25,000

With experience, you could be promoted to higher grades like supervisor and manager which would result in a higher salary.
