Social Worker - as a Social Worker you will work with adults, children and families and often specialise in a specific field of work - such as support for children and families or working with adults with physical disability or mental health related needs.

Day to day tasks

- Assess client needs based on physical, emotional, behavioural and financial circumstances.

- Design personalised care and treatment plans for each client, including visits, resources, and objectives.

- Offer access to health care, educational resources, and occupational assistance.

- Evaluate patient and client progress to determine how to set further goals for improvement.

 Collaborate with health care professionals, other social worker and legal personnel.

5 GCSEs - grades 4 or above including English and Maths

Minimum 2 A Levels – grade B or above An honour (BA or BSc) or a postgraduate degree in social work
