
# **Parliament Outreach**

### **AQA Unlocking Potential**

Following on from the success of last year's programme, we have again been involved in the AQA Unlocking Potential Programme. A group of Year 9 students have been working with ex professional rugby player, Paul Broadbent to run a social action project. The students travelled to Manchester to propose



their idea in a Dragon's Den style pitch. The students were granted the funding they needed and will be delivering the project to a local primary school and care home.

#### Bahamas

A group of 16 Year 9 and 10 students travelled to the Bahamas to explore the British Values and what they look like in a Commonwealth country. The trip was funded by the Turing Scheme and gave our students a once in a lifetime experience. As part of the visit we spent a day at The Queen's College, our students spent the morning helping out in the primary school and then in the afternoon they had the opportunity to join in with some lessons in the secondary school. Students also had a guided tour of Parliament where they learnt all about the similarities between the Bahamian Parliament and our own Parliament. The British High Commissioner invited both staff and students to meet him at his Residency, the students learnt all about his role in The Bahamas. We spent our final day at the Atlantis Waterpark where students enjoyed the river rapids and sliding through the shark tank.
