Dear parent / carer

As you will now be aware, in response to the ongoing Covid-19 Coronavirus outbreak, the UK government has made the decision to close schools for the majority of students as of Monday 23rd March.

During this difficult and unprecedented time, we want to minimise disruption to students' education as far as possible. Year 10 is a key year for the completion of a high percentage of the GCSE course but we are committed to providing our students with high quality, engaging work which will enable us to cover all course content. There can be no doubt that those students who continue to work at home during this period, will be most successful in their GCSE exams. As we are unsure how long schools will be closed, it is essential that students begin to form good working habits from Monday and we are asking for your support to ensure that this happens. We may not be in the same building, but learning can and will still take place. How much work students are completing will be monitored and parents will be contacted where this falls below an acceptable level.

For students in year 10, work will be emailed to students by 9am each morning. Each day, every student will receive:

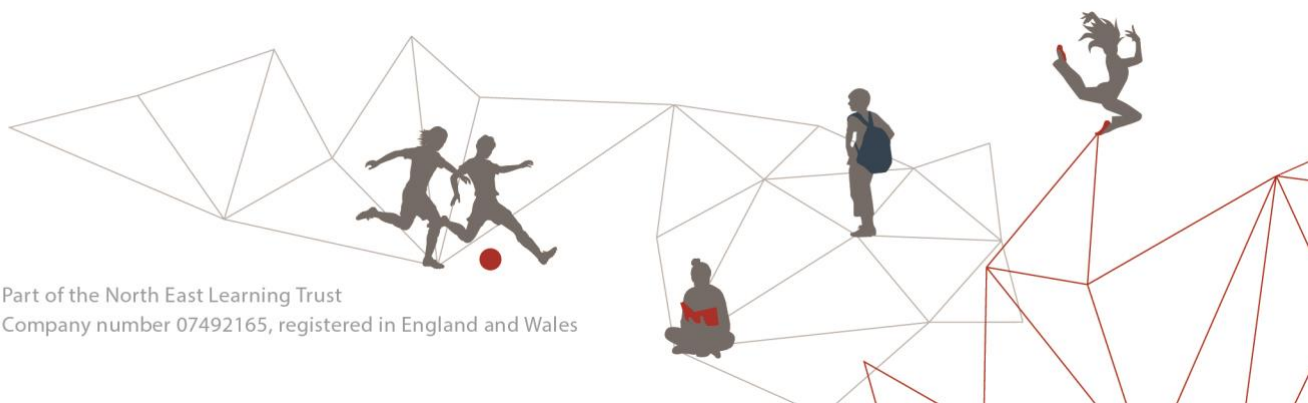
- 1 x hour of English, maths and science work
- ½ hour of work for all options subjects

Your child will receive one email per subject each morning which we believe will prevent students from feeling overwhelmed and also support you as parents in helping to organise how and when this will be done. Students can choose the order in which tasks are completed but they should aim to complete all work by the end of each day. We would also encourage students to read for pleasure as often as possible.

Students have been told that they can contact class teachers during school time who will do their best to answer promptly. Please remember that some staff will still be in school caring for the children of key workers and may not be able to answer as promptly as others. Students have been instructed to use this line of communication sensibly and have been informed that ALL communication via school email is recorded. **Office 365 must be the only way students communicate with school staff.**
