Job purpose:

To be responsible for the efficient and effective supervision of students across different age groups and ability levels. You will develop positive working relationships with students, teaching staff, other professionals and parents/carers, as well as promoting positive pupil behaviour and conduct at all times and working within the Academy's policies, procedures and ethos.

Duties and responsibilities:

- To supervise students in the teacher's absence and communicate the work set by the class teacher to the students.
- To work alongside the students keeping them on task, discussing work with them
 offering any support and advice.
- To manage student's behaviour whilst supervising, feedback any information from the lesson to the teacher regarding behaviour and any other important issues.
- To support the work of the SENCo and students with special educational needs as directed by the SENCo.
- To accompany staff on educational visits.
- To provide classroom support activities.
- To supervise homework after school club as required.
- To support/supervise lunchtime clubs as required.
- To act as an exam invigilator as and when required.
- To undertake school detention as and when required.
- To supervise students during beak and lunchtimes as and when required.

- You will present yourself as a role model to pupils in speech, dress, behaviour and attitude
