This term we launched our brand new Sports Hub, which has revolutionised extra-curricular activities at Easington Academy!

As part of the new Sports Hub, all students have had the opportunity to join a development centre in football, rugby or netball and have had access to elite coaching by our specialist PE team, with clear pathways to school teams and local sports clubs.

Sessions take place after school and at lunchtimes with opportunities to compete in inter-house, inter-school and inter-trust competitions.

During the launch day, over 100 students took part in the activities on offer.
