What is it?

A dressmaker is a skilled artisan who designs, creates, alters, and repairs custom-made clothing, particularly dresses. They work with clients to create garments that fit perfectly and meet specific style and fabric preferences. Dressmakers can work independently, in fashion houses, or in tailoring shops.

Qualifications/Experience Required:

You will require a qualification in fashion design, garment construction, and sewing offered by colleges and fashion schools. Apprenticeships and internships with experienced dressmakers or tailors can provide valuable hands-on experience. Key skills include proficiency in sewing, pattern making, and a strong understanding of different fabrics and garment construction techniques.

What the Work Involves:

Consulting with clients to understand their garment requirements, including style, fabric, and fit preferences. Taking precise measurements to ensure a perfect fit. Creating patterns based on client specifications and adjusting existing patterns as needed. Cutting fabric and sewing garments using various techniques, including hand sewing and machine stitching. Performing fittings and making necessary adjustments to achieve the desired fit and look.
