World Ready

Students take part in a weekly World Ready lesson which educates them on Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) as well as Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). This term during World Ready, Year 7 have focused on healthy relationships, alcohol and vaping. Year 8 students have covered consent and mental health. Year 9 students have focused on consent and contraception. Our Year 10 students have explored careers, the labour market and marriage.



Sextortion

Earlier in the term we informed you that the National Crime Agency had sent an alert following the increase in the number of young people who were becoming victims of 'sextortion'. Since then all students have taken part in a World Ready lesson on the topic. Please continue to discuss the topic with your child at home to remind them of the dangers.

Paris

A group of Year 8 and 9 students travelled to Paris to explore the sights and practise their French. The students visited the Eiffel Tower, Euro Disney, Sacre Cœur, the Louvre and had a cruise down the Seine. The students also had the opportunity to try French cuisines, including crêpes and croissants. Our budding linguists had a brilliant experience and we can't wait to see how their French has developed having had the opportunity to put it into practice.



Duke of Edinburgh

This year we had 15 students taking part in the Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award and 37 in the Bronze Award. The students walked along Hadrian's Wall, with the Silver students covering 30 miles in three days and the Bronze students covering 15 miles over two days. The students also had to ensure they were self-sufficient by carrying their tents, stoves and food for the weekend. In the past year our students have accumulated a staggering 1,560 volunteering hours, which has a social value of £8236.

Our students took part in the NELT Summer Concert at the Glass House (formerly the Sage). Our students brought the magic of the movies to the stage as they performed The Power of Love, Earth Angel and Johnny B Goode from Back to the Future. Our soloists performed alongside other students from schools within the Trust in a number of amazing group performances. Their hard work truly paid off as their performance was spectacular.
