At Easington Academy, our Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) programme is designed to make a measurable and meaningful impact on students' personal development, aspirations, and future outcomes.

Impact on Students

1. Raised Aspirations and Motivation

- Students are exposed to a wide range of career pathways, helping them to set ambitious goals and see the relevance of their education.
- Encounters with employers and role models inspire students to pursue careers they may not have previously considered.

2. Improved Decision-Making

- Students who see a clear connection between school and future success are more likely to attend, participate, and achieve.

- Our destination tracking shows that students' progress into a wide range of positive outcomes including apprenticeships, college, sixth form, and employment.
- The programme supports students to navigate transitions confidently and successfully.

6. Support for All Learners

- Bespoke provision for SEND and disadvantaged students ensures equity of access to careers guidance and opportunities.
- Adaptive programmes and targeted interventions help all students to thrive.
