An ageing population

Increased need for mental health and community care

Advances in technology and integrated care systems

Focus on Anxiety and Transitions - KS3 and KS4

Moving from KS3 to KS4—or from school to college—can feel overwhelming. Here are some tips:

For Students:

- Talk to someone you trust about your worries
- Visit colleges early to get familiar with the environment
- Use careers platforms like Unifrog to explore options at your own pace
- Practice small steps—mock interviews, short work experience days

For Parents:

- Reassure your child that feeling anxious is normal
- Attend open events together
- Focus on strengths and interests rather than pressure
- Encourage gradual exposure to new settings

Pathway Focus - Traineeships

What Are Traineeships?

Traineeships are short programmes (6 weeks to 12 months) designed to help young people aged 16–24 gain work experience, develop skills, and prepare for apprenticeships or employment.

Benefits:

- Real work experience with local employers
- Support with English, Maths, and employability skills
- A stepping stone to apprenticeships or full-time work
- Flexible and tailored to individual needs

Traineeships focus on employability and sector-specific skills. Common areas include:

- Business Administration
- Customer Service
- Construction Trades
- Engineering Basics
- Health & Social Care
- Digital Skills
- Hospitality & Catering

Who Are They For?

Students who are not yet ready for an apprenticeship but want practical experience and training.

Subject Focus of the Month - History

History develops skills in research, analysis, and critical thinking—valuable in many careers.

Careers Linked to History:

- Archivist Preserving historical documents and records
- Museum Curator Managing collections and exhibitions
- Lawyer Using analytical skills to build cases
- Journalist Investigating and reporting stories
- Policy Advisor Shaping decisions based on historical context
- Teacher Inspiring future generations

Activity Idea:

Explore how historical events have shaped modern healthcare or engineering innovations.

Parent Tip of the Month – Work Experience Placements

Work experience is a fantastic opportunity for students to explore the world of work, develop confidence, and gain skills that employers value. Parents play a key role in making this experience successful.

How Parents Can Help:

Talk about the placement – Discuss what your child hopes to learn and any worries they might have.

Help with preparation – Check travel arrangements, dress code, and any paperwork.

Encourage professionalism – Remind them about punctuality, good communication, and a positive attitude.

Reflect afterwards – Ask what they enjoyed, what they learned, and how it might influence future choices.

Celebrate the effort – Completing a placement is a big achievement!
